This go-live is the culmination of a LOT of hard work with our implementation partner and Workday themselves. Like everyone else at UMMC, Covid-19 has forced us to alter our meeting style and how we'll provide a command center support model, but the product has been tested and validated and is ready to go! We are looking forward to April 6th – let's Make Your Workday Count!

Where are we in the project?

Move to Production and Validation thereof is underway for Supply Chain Management Contracts, Procurement, Receiving/Inventory, Accounts Payable, Assets go-live April 6th. Reminder communications were sent to targeted groups detailing stop, pause and start dates.

A special thanks to the End-to-End Testers that dedicated their time and effort to complete the Student testing in the past two weeks.

The Student team has completed Phase 1 End-to-End Testing and will roll in to User Acceptance Testing on March 30th. The E2E testing consisted of the Recruiting, Admissions, Program Chairs and Deans, and Project Team. As of today, we've been able to successfully complete over 80% of the testing scenarios. Our teams came together each day, logged in to the Workday testing environment and test out the scenarios created by Christi Hardy (Director, Student Admissions). Christi spent countless hours, working with the Workday consultants, to create over 430 testing scenarios for the E2E testing period. A huge thank you goes out to Christi for this remarkable effort.

User Acceptance Testing is scheduled to take place via WebEx beginning March 30th. Using WebEx for testing is a new concept for us, but we're all willing to take the lead and get this UAT underway. We're excited for this new adventure and will put forth our effort to complete the week of testing, while practicing social distancing, but still working very closely to ensure our Workday product is working seamlessly.
