Dr. Williams is an Assistant Professor at the University of Mississippi Medical Center with a joint appointment in the Department of Population Health Science and the Cancer Institute. Dr. Williams' research is focused on developing population-specific health behavior interventions that will lead to a reduction in cancer disparities in the US and low and middle income countries, such as Ghana, West Africa.

Dr. Williams' research interests include the science of health disparities, cancer prevention behaviors, mHealth, qualitative research, and mixed method research. She is currently working on studies that are aimed at using telehealth to improve cancer outcomes in rural and medically underserved areas.

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
