Dr. Sam Pace receives 2018 80% By 2018 National Achievement Award RJD

Many Mississippians know that Samuel C. Pace, MD, has spent his entire professional career fighting colorectal cancer. Many also know that, even though he is allegedly "retired", Dr. Pace continues to fight this disease every day, both as a gastroenterologist and as a survivor. In 2015 he received the first annual SCOPY Award (Service Award for Colorectal Cancer Outreach, Prevention and Year-Round Excellence) from the

American College of Gastroenterology. In 2016 he received the first and only Mississippi Colorectal Cancer Champion of the Year award. Now the rest of the nation will have the opportunity to learn about Dr. Pace's passionate commitment to the prevention and cure of colorectal cancer as he receives the 2018 80% By 2018 National Achievement Award from the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable!
